married Frank Janiszeski

Alex Jaworski - 1886- Warsaw, Mazowieckie, Poland  
married Josephine Sovell

Anton Sovell - 1842 Warsaw, Mazowieckie- Pennsylvania, then Ivanhoe = buried wilno

Frances Koral Kabot - 1876 Warsaw, Mazowieckie

Marciana Piotrowski - 1831 Pomorskie  
married Joseph Sadojerski at Ujście, Pila, Wielkopolskie,

Annie Hinkelmann Ochocki - 1851 Strasburg (german) Brodnica, Kuyavian-Pomeranian  
married Frank Ochocki- Says his parerents are from Russia

John Piekarski -1816  
Czarniż, Chojnice, Pomerania, Poland
